

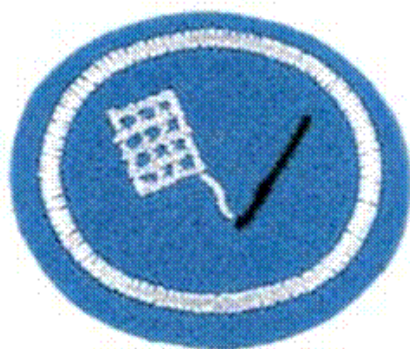


Pathfinder Honour: Requirements & Framework

Snapshot of Honour

You will learn the various crocheting stitches: Chain Stitch, Double Crochet, Slip Stich, Half Treble Crochet, Treble Crochet, Double Treble, Triple Treble and other crocheting terms. You will know how to care for items made from wool, orlon, nylon, or cotton.

To help remember the finer points of crocheting, you will fashion sample pieces such as granny squares and edging.

Best of all, you will use your creativity and your own hands to create beautiful handicrafts such as a hat, scarf, pillow cover, sleeveless sweater or slippers. All are great gifts.

#Skill Level:	Level 2
<u>Pre-requisites Honours:</u>	Nil
Preparation Time:	Average (4-8 hrs);
Physical Requirements:	Minimal
Equipment/Materials Required:	Crocheting 'tools', yarn, Crocheting patterns.

British terms are used throughout. See table of British / USA equivalents below.

1. Define and crochet the following: *CH, DC, HTR, TR, DTR, TTR, ST, SP, STS, RND, INCL, INC, DEC.*
2. Make squares of at least 20 stitches of the following: ~~SC~~, CH, DC, ~~HDC~~, HTR, TR, DTR.
3. Show how to measure stitch gauge or row gauge on sample squares.
4. Know how to care for items made out of wool, orlon, nylon, and cotton.
5. Know how to make a granny square, and show something you have made using a granny square, such as a hat, scarf, pillow cover, etc.
6. Show a sample of simple edging you have made out of thread.
7. Crochet one of the following out of yarn: hat, scarf, sleeveless sweater, or slippers.
