1. *Know and adhere to the safety requirements as applicable to the Glass Painting Honour.*
2. Know the primary colours; the secondary colours *and* how to mix the primary colours to obtain the secondary colours.
3. ~~Know the materials used in painting, mounting, and hanging a glass painting.~~ Know the materials used in preparing, painting and baking a glass item for glass painting using water-based and oil-based glass paints.
4. ~~Make and display a glass painting for each of the following designs:~~
  - ~~a. Animal~~
  - ~~b. Flower~~
  - ~~c. Seenery.~~Paint a picture on a drinking glass.
5. ~~Make a silhouette on glass and mount them for hanging.~~ Paint a silhouette picture on a piece of glass (ie glass coaster or glass tile).
6. ~~Make a hand-painted mirror picture, by removing the back coating of the mirror from the picture area and painting the design on the back of the mirror glass.~~ Using oil-based paints (or acrylic paints if oil-based paints are not available), paint a glass candle holder or another glass ornament which will not be used for food or drink.
7. Paint an abstract design on a light bulb.
8. Paint a hand-painted picture by using the reverse painting technique on a glass picture frame using acrylic paints.
