

World Pathfinder Day Service Program Suggestion

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This suggested order of service is designed to be culturally adaptable across world divisions while preserving the spiritual depth, dignity, and joy of World Pathfinder Day. Churches and clubs are encouraged to contextualize music, language, and creative elements to reflect their local culture while maintaining the global theme.

Welcome / Introduction to Pathfinder Day

Provide a concise welcome that explains the significance of World Pathfinder Day and introduces the theme “Speak, Lord!”

Emphasize listening to God’s voice, responding in obedience, and empowering young people to lead today.

Countdown Video (Optional)

Use a brief and engaging countdown video to build anticipation and focus attention.

If technology is limited, this may be replaced with live music, instrumental prelude, or coordinated audience participation.

Formation for the Processional

Prepare Pathfinders and leaders for the entrance procession in an orderly and reverent manner. Ensure flags, uniforms, and formations reflect excellence and unity.

Processional

Begin with a formal processional entry accompanied by music and flags (local, Pathfinder, and church flags as appropriate).

This marks the official opening of the service and visually represents the global movement of Pathfinders.



Invocation

Offer an opening prayer inviting God's presence and asking that hearts be attentive to His voice.

Pathfinder Song

Sing the Pathfinder Song to affirm identity, mission, and unity across nations.

Pledge, Law, Aim, and Motto

Have all Pathfinders recite the Pledge, Law, Aim, and Motto together. This public declaration reinforces commitment to Christ and the values of the movement.

Welcome and Announcements

Provide essential announcements related to the day's activities. Keep this segment concise and purposeful.

Director's Greeting Video

Play the greeting from World Pathfinder Director Pr. Alfred Kwasi Asiem.

If video capability is unavailable, a written message may be read by a designated leader.

Opening Song

Select an uplifting, Christ-centered worship song aligned with the theme *Speak, Lord!*.

Encourage congregational participation.

Prayer

Offer a prayer of gratitude and commitment, asking God to help each Pathfinder hear and respond to His calling.



Special Presentation

Include a special act such as music, spoken word, drama, or cultural expression that reflects the theme.

Creativity is encouraged, provided it maintains reverence and spiritual focus. s

Scripture Reading

Select a biblical passage centered on listening to God's voice (for example, 1 Samuel 3:10).

Allow space for reflection and spiritual attentiveness.

Tithe and Offering

Collect tithe and a special offering in support of the Pathfinder Club and its mission initiatives.

Briefly explain how these funds strengthen youth ministry locally and globally.

Second Special Presentation (Optional)

A second musical or creative presentation may be included to maintain engagement and variety.



Sermon

Select an inspiring message aligned with the theme **Speak, Lord!**
The sermon should be Christ-centered, mission-focused, and globally relevant.

Closing Song

End with a joyful, faith-affirming song that reinforces commitment to listen and respond to God.

Closing Prayer

Offer a final prayer of dedication, asking that Pathfinders not only hear God's voice but actively respond in service.

Fellowship Meal (Lunch)

Following the service, provide time for fellowship and community connection, respecting local customs and Sabbath observance practices.

This informal gathering strengthens relationships and reinforces unity.

Program Objective

This order of service integrates worship, identity, mission, creativity, and global unity.

When implemented thoughtfully, it ensures World Pathfinder Day 2026 becomes more than a program—it becomes a spiritual moment where young people worldwide declare:

**"Speak, Lord...
Your servant
is listening."**
