Below are practical ways Pathfinder clubs worldwide can translate spiritual attentiveness into community impact.

1. Listen First: Identify Community Needs

Before acting, listen.

- ★ Conduct surveys or community conversations.

- ★ Ask: *What is God already doing here—and how can we join Him?*
